We're a little more than halfway through our Lenten journey toward the central images of our faith: Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, the Last Supper, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Cross, and then Easter. Although we know the end of the story, we bring to mind the events of the last days of Jesus, "who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross." But we don't remember and re-tell the story of Jesus' last days without continuing on to the rest of the story, the Easter joy of resurrection and new life!

As I write this column, the snowbanks where I live are still high and the rivers are still jammed with ice, and so looking toward spring seems itself an exercise in faith. Winter was cold and snowy this year, with snow upon snow upon snow. But underneath the snow and cold, the bulbs are getting ready to send shoots of new life up and out toward the light. We can't see them yet, but we know that they are there. Just yesterday, I heard a blue jay's flute-like spring song, saw turkey vultures soaring in the sky, and watched a number of crows conspire to take over a group of treetops. I believe that spring will come!

As we observe the last few weeks of Lent, remember that this is a time of year when many people who have come from a church with a liturgical tradition (for example, Episcopalians, Roman Catholics, and Lutherans) but who are no longer active tend to miss familiar traditions. Even when they don't have a regular "church family," they may still mark their own observances of Lent. What a wonderful opportunity to invite someone to church! The services in each church are different, but it is the same Resurrection that we proclaim and celebrate on Easter! Over 80% of people who join a church do so because they were invited by someone they know. Maybe you know someone who'd like to join us this Easter?
