Join us for Maundy Thursday & **Easter Services**



Maundy-Thursday service-will be observed on April 1st, 2021 at 4:30 pm Easter Service- will be celebrated on Sunday, April 4th, 2021 at 10:00am

Both services will be in our church Sanctuary and on Facebook and YouTube. We will need to follow the CDC guidelines of wearing masks, and social distancing must be observed. This is what you can expect when you come to church:

- * All people entering the church MUST wear a mask. If you are sick, please stay home.
- * Upon entering the church, you will have your temperature taken with a no touch thermometer, you will be asked the typical Covid questions, extra masks will be available and you will be asked to use the hand sanitizer available.
- * We ask that you not leave your seat to visit with others. Every other pew will be blocked off for spacing.
- * A bulletin will be placed on your seat earlier in the week. Please take it home with you no recycling available in the church.
- * There will be no singing during the worship service.
- * We will have to wait for a safer time to include "passing the peace".
- * An offering plate will be placed in the back of the sanctuary. Please add your offering when you arrive.
- * The upstairs bathrooms are available for use. Disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer will be available in or near the bathrooms for your use. Please use the wipes to clean surfaces you touch before and after use (including door knobs).
- * If, at any time, the state tells us we cannot worship in the church, we will contact you by email or phone and will resume services on Facebook and YouTube only.

Food Pantry - gave the church \$1000 towards plowing this year

Comcast - our bill the last 2 months increased to \$160 - so Linda G called and got a deal qualifying us for a \$60 a month pandemic special offer

Workmans Comp Insurance - we reviewed our workman's comp insurance with Spence and Matthews and because our payroll has decreased we are getting a rebate of \$372 off our policy.

Willett Trust fund- trying to figure out what actions are necessary and if it makes sense to terminate this trust fund - Massachusetts Commonwealth Law for terminating a trust is \$200,000 or under - the Willett Trust Fund meets this requirement it's currently \$168,000. The trustees will keep you updated



Wakefield Congregational Church - we had a zoom meeting with them to see what ideas or practices we can use and share as we continue working on our profile and seek a settled pastor for our church. They were a great source of information

Roof leak - Ken and Gregg will look at and assess the situation before next winter.

Amy Gowell - Trustees decided to increase her pay by \$10 per week for the great work she's doing on videoing our church services and uploading on youtube

The Trustees continue to address items that are identified in the monthly checklist
