TRUSTEES' NEWSLETTER

The trustees met on November 18th, 2018. We are pleased Michael Watman has agreed to join the trustees finance committee. We appreciate his willingness to help with the finances of the church.

Gerri Canon will step down as a Building and Grounds Trustee as of January 2019.

There are currently three trustee openings. Two are for Building and Grounds and one is for the Finance Committee. It is the hope of the trustees that people will seriously consider accepting one of these positions.

Pledge letters have been sent out and pledge cards are expected back by November 18, 2018.

Bruce Robbins reported the furnaces at the church and parsonage have been cleaned and all septic tanks have been pumped. Bruce and Richard Shephard did the fall clean up and painted the parking lanes. Bruce will arrange for a maintenance check for the church's sump pump and battery backup power supply.

Ken Latchaw provided an update on the parsonage work. Approximately fifty percent of the work has been completed.

Linda Farrell provided the treasurer's report for 2018. September's income \$9,136.00. Expenses were \$17,033.00 for a \$7,897.00 loss. Year to date total income \$167,358.00. Expenses \$131,211.00. For a net of \$36,147.00. The check book balance is \$14,458.05. Total checkbook funds available \$13,109.98. The mortgage balance is \$40,394.25. Year to date we have had to withdraw \$25,000 to meet expenses.

The committee discussed the need to hire a payroll service company.

The Trustees welcome Rev. Dr. Norma Brettell to our congregation! She will be starting as our interim pastor in December.
