

Lent Begins

The 40 day season of the church year, Lent, begins on Ash Wednesday, February 6th. We will gather for worship with our friends AT The United Methodist Church, Berwick on that day at 7PM.

The 40 days become an opportunity, a possibility, a definite "set aside time", for God, and God alone. I hear often, about "giving up something" (like eating chocolate, or that extra cup of coffee), which, in itself isn't bad, but it lacks the "umph" of what Lent represents. We parallel the 40 days of Jesus in the wilderness, to prepare our hearts and reflect on our lives, in preparation for Easter, for Resurrection Day.

Truth is, we, in this country, have it too easy. Yes, we have our own face to face troubles of illness, ups and downs of family relationships, AND economic concerns. But we don't, by and large, starve, or go without heat, or not eat out.

We might begin our journey with a deep thanks to God, and consider those who DO go without—neighbors we know, and the myriad of countries who struggle for water, or food, or an opportunity to live without fear.

> Lent is a time for YOU to look inside Scripture, spend time in prayer, be a part of weekly worship. God wants YOU to begin a mission initiative. It's is YOUR time to get up, and get going. Give up being selfish.

Celebrate the love and care that God HAS given, and share it.

To help with your Lenten preparations, Lenten Devotionals will be available beginning Sunday, 2/3 in the Library area. There's something for everyone.

If you find yourself in the hospital unexpectedly:

- 1. **YOU need to clearly request** that Pastor Mark be called, or
- 2. YOU need to request that you'd like to see the hospital chaplain, who CAN call Pastor Mark and let him and our Church community know you are there.

We want to surround you with love, support and care, but we cannot do that if we never find out you are ill or needing/wanting a visit. Wentworth-Douglass Hospital and Portsmouth Regional Hospital have a chaplain on staff. Frisbie Memorial Hospital has a network of volunteer chaplains. First Parish Church also has Caregivers who are happy to visit you at home or at the hospital. **The key is communication!**

Election of new officers are: President - Fran Nichols Vice President - Toni Rhode Secretary - Janice Wentworth Treasurer - Helene Courier






Riverside Rest Home Pen Pal Program
