Many times I read newsletter articles that are entitled "From The (insert person's title here) Desk." And I chuckle to myself and wonder if the desk talks. Or writes. And although my heart neither talks nor writes, I want to share with you in these columns what is on my heart for us as we live into this transition time together.

Epiphany is my favorite liturgical season. Our word "epiphany" comes from a Greek word meaning a "revealing," or a revelation of the divine. The liturgical season of Epiphany begins with the star shining brightly so that the Magi observe, follow, and see Immanuel, God-with-Us. As the season unfolds, we celebrate the baptism of Jesus, honoring his choice to show solidarity with all of humanity in receiving baptism. Our readings tell the story of Jesus' beginning to preach, and the calling of the first disciples, who *left everything and followed him.* We'll hear again the Sermon on the Plain (in Luke; in Matthew it's the Sermon on the Mount), and remember what and who the beatitudes call us to be, and what Jesus looks at as blessing. We'll be called again to love our enemies, to bless those who curse us, to turn the other cheek. When someone asks us to walk with them one mile, we're called to go with them two. The measure with which we measure is the measure that will be measured back to us. Then the season of Epiphany ends with Transfiguration Sunday (this year it falls on March 3rd), when the disciples really see Jesus in a new way and they hear this: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

It seems to me that the season of Epiphany can be seen as kind of a metaphor for the transition time in a church. We are called to remember who and whose we are. We delight to remember and celebrate again that God is indeed with us! The season of Epiphany draws us further in the journey, and each new revealing of who Jesus is helps us to see *who we are* – as individuals, as a community, as a church – and *who we are called to be*.

I'll remind you from time to time during this transition time that as we are preparing – growing, learning, changing – to get ready for a new settled pastor for First Parish, God is preparing the heart of someone to be your next settled pastor. And so just as God is working to transition and transform First Church into the church God has in mind (and heart) for you to be, God is even still working in the heart of your next pastor to transition them to be your next pastor. As God's time unfolds, both of these paths of the work of God in our lives will converge and be revealed! In the meantime, let us be willing to embrace work of the congregation during the transition!

God bless you with Epiphany light and revelations! Pastor Norma

TRUSTEES

The Trustees have been working hard behind the scenes to ensure that the church runs smoothly during this time of transition - here's a list of activities we've been working on.

- **Parsonage Update** John LaBreck completed the parsonage work on 14 Jan 2019 and submitted a final bill totaling \$8,740 for a grand total of \$28,740. Carpets and vinyl will be installed by Bourque's Flooring company of Somersworth NH. The total renovations should be completed by 31 Jan 2019.
- Furnace Vent A new furnace vent was installed by DF Richard in December.
- **-Leola Pepler Trust Fund Update** Based on requirements from lawyer, Sue Thibeau's office (susan@thibeaulaw.com), we provided her office with the 2018 4th quarter statement of the Leola Pepler Trust Fund. A petition will be sent to the York County Probate Court to seek terminating the trust held at Citizens Bank, Manchester NH.

ADP Payroll status - Ken, Mike and Linda are finalizing all ADP payroll requirements. A big thanks to all for making this happen. Mike worked with all employees to complete the required I9 Forms.

- **Budget Review** Mike spearheaded the budget review process, going line by line on each item to accurately present a budget for 2019 at the church budget meeting which was held on 13 Jan 2019. We are looking at approximately a \$37,000 deficit for 2019. Funds will have to be drawn from our investment accounts.
- New Committee Member Nominations Rich Whitten and Mike Watman will be officially nominated at the Annual Church meeting on 27 Jan 2019. There are still 3 Building and Grounds positions open. If you're interested in joining, please speak with a Board of Trustees member.
- **Insurance Board Questionnaire** -The completed questionnaire was mailed to Skip Clark, a Senior Consultant at ACS Group, for our UCC Insurance on the church and parsonage.
- **Consolidated Investment Funds** An account information form has been updated and signed by the church moderator, Rich Whitten, and was submitted to Atlantic Fund Services, LLC.
- Comcast Business Install -The Trustees agreed to move forward on changing from Consolidated Communications to Comcast, updating internet and telephone services. A site install survey was completed on 14 Jan with an install date in the process of being scheduled.
- **Elevator Inspection** NH Elevator Inspection company completed the required annual inspection on 14 Jan 2019 certificate will be forthcoming.
- **Electricity Rate's** The Trustees are reviewing different suppliers to see if there's a possibility to save some money on our energy needs.
