Dear Members and Friends of First Parish UCC Somersworth,

At the congregational meeting held on Sunday, December 4, 2022, members of First Parish United Church of Christ (Congregational), came together and voted to support the Call Agreement of Pastor Thomas Gardner. Twenty-seven members of First Parish voted to accept him as their half-time Settled Minister.

How blessed we are to have found Pastor Tom and to have him join our family after our long search for the right candidate. Pastor Tom is the 6th minister to be called into the ministry at First Parish in its 293 years of history. He is the 38th minister since the church's settlement in old Summersworth.

Pastor Tom will start his ministry with us on Sunday, December 18th, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, at our new worship time of 9am.

Please join us on the 18th and be there in support of our church's future and life together with Pastor Tom. For now, he'll be in our church office on Mondays, Wednesdays and Sundays He will continue to serve half time at the First Congregational Church of Farmington, NH but he is available by phone any time he is needed. More information will follow in the January Newsletter.

Again, please note our new worship time of 9am, beginning on Sunday, December 18th, and join us as we celebrate our church's new beginning with excitement and celebration of our new minister, Pastor Thomas Gardner.


