I thought it important to share an update about our Church Cluster Coaching.

First Parish UCC has participated in few cluster coaching conference calls; Pastor Mark has had a few clergy focused conference calls. There has been "homework" for both laity and clergy prior to these cluster calls. We are accountable to our "coach", Rev. Paul Nickerson. We have unlimited access to him as well.

FYI: Our cluster consists of: Longmeadow Congregational Church, Auburn, NH; Lee Church Congregational, Lee, NH and First Parish UCC, Somersworth, NH. The other churches are in Hampstead, Charlestown, Kensington, Center Harbor, West Concord, and Littleton.

We are reminded us that *our goal is to bear fruit by making connections in our community and appropriately inviting people to experience relationships of hope, faith and love.* I continue to seek intentional ways to spend 20% of my time outside of the church, in settings that are visible, and in places where I can potentially interact with people. The Deacons, individually have been asked to initiate member-guest activities to engage unchurched friends in relationship building.

While the Deacons initiate these strategies, the vision shared, voted and affirmed by our Congregation gathered at the Annual Meeting, is that the wider church, YOU, our congregation's members and friends will, with guidance, implement these same strategies. <u>And Undergirding all of this work is prayer</u>, the ministry of our Prayer Group, our unified prayer in worship.

We believe we are being asked by God's loving Spirit to experience new growth if we will work together. Being disciples of Jesus Christ, "leads us into paths we would not choose for ourselves".

We believe God has guided, and is guiding us to take this Spirit-filled leap of faith to build up our church as we share the power of the Good News. While ideas to draw in new people are needed, the willingness to move the idea into action is more helpful. Please feel free to speak with your Deacons, and be prepared for when the Deacons speak with you \sim seeking you to be actively involved in a member-guest activity.

May the power of the Holy Spirit bless us into abundant faith and life!

Fifty days after Jesus' resurrection, on a day called Pentecost, the community of believers, followers, disciples of Jesus was gifted with the Holy Spirit, the presence of the living God. Because Pentecost was a holiday celebrating the harvest (a bit like our Thanksgiving), the apostles and a large crowd had gathered to celebrate in Jerusalem. Many people had assembled near Peter and the other followers of Christ when "[F]rom heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind ... " (Acts 2:ff, NRSV]. Then tongues of fire descended on everyone in the crowd. After the wind and fire descended, all sorts of languages, known and unknown, came out of the crowd. Each person spoke "about God's deeds of power" (verse 11). No wonder Luke wrote, "All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?" (verse 12). The whole affair was mind-boggling and life-changing. The Holy Spirit had come upon many people; they knew God was powerfully at work in their midst. On Pentecost many years ago, some 3,000 people came to believe in Christ. That's why today Christians remember this powerful event as the birthday of the Church. Pentecost falls on Sunday, June 8th. To celebrate Pentecost, you are invited to worship, wearing something red, orange, yellow-symbolic of the Holy Spirit, and tongues of fire. Come, Holy Spirit, come!

We are beginning our backpack collection on Sunday, June 1 and it will continue throughout the summer, ending on Sunday, August 18. We are collecting backpacks and items to go in them for local school children who would otherwise not have one. We are looking for backpacks in new or gently used condition, pens, pencils, pink erasers, glue sticks, notebooks, folders, colored pencils, rulers, pencil cases, and washable markers. A sign up sheet is in the Narthex along with a bin to put your donated items in. The "adopt a backpack" has become very popular. By adopting a packpack, you supply the backpack complete with all the requested items. This is a great family project. We are in need of backpacks. Please keep an out out for new or gently used backpacks.

United Church of Christ General Synod files lawsuit.

Posted in the Narthex, with copies on the literature table, is a <u>Pastoral Letter</u> from Rev. Gary Schulte, NH Conference Minister. The letter outlines that the UCC General Synod has filed a lawsuit in North Carolina, arguing that the state's marriage laws violate the First Amendment right of freedom of religion. In North Carolina, it is a criminal offense to perform a marriage ceremony without a license from the state. At issue is, that, without a state issued marriage license, no couple may have a religious marriage solemnized. As same-sex couples may not obtain a marriage license in North Carolina, any church ceremony to bless that couple becomes a criminal action. New Hampshire has an equitable approach to marriage. Couples can obtain a license, and can have their marriage blessed in the church.

The North Carolina lawsuit places the clergy who seek to support a couple having their relationship blessed by the church, but without a license in legal jeopardy! I have been asked, and have officiated at blessing ceremonies for couples who chose NOT to marry, legally, meaning, they did not obtain a license. This happens for various reasons, but usually this means one or both would lose various benefits if they marry. Sometimes the parties involved are widowed, or one or both have a disability. The reasons are compelling. I still meet, I still do pre-marital counseling, we talk about their relationship, and why have any religious ceremony at all, whether in the church or not. And, if I had done this in North Carolina...I could be prosecuted.

Presently, the marriage guidelines of First Parish Church do not allow me to perform a marriage ceremony for a same-sex couple in the church. While I have not been asked to do so, I have been very clear that I do not have any hesitation in doing such a ceremony. If asked, I would do the same premarital work. It becomes my choice to officiate, or not, for a ceremony outside the church, and I would always keep the Deacons informed. For me, this issue would be nudged if a covenant member of our church, who is gay or lesbian wanted to enter into a covenanted relationship and have a blessing in the church. Their covenant membership, their baptismal grace, is no different than anyone else's. The Pastoral Letter mentioned here gave me the opportunity to share a bit about where we are around these very pastoral aspects of ministry. I wanted to share openly, and invite you, agree or disagree, to speak with me if you would like further conversation. ~Pastor Mark
