Dear Ones:

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Risen Savior, Jesus Christ!

Having served as your Pastor and Teacher for 33 years, I find myself at a crossroad in my life and ministry. After deep personal prayer and reflection, and in conversation with my family, I am resigning as the Pastor and Teacher of First Parish Church. I am not seeking another pastoral call and will retire from active ministry.

My ordination to the Christian ministry in First Parish Church has brought the building of many long, multi-generational relationships. Through these years we've shared many points of joy through the celebrations of weddings, baptisms, confirmations, new members, and yes, funerals. Weekly worship has gathered us for prayer, praise and proclamation. We've celebrated the sacraments from which we've drawn nurture and sustenance. Our relationship with Jesus Christ continues to unfold, as we heed the call to love God, love neighbor, and love self. The challenge to ***"be the church"***—the face of God's love in the world is ever before us. God's embrace sends us out as ambassadors into the world, through many places of outreach and caring, as in The Community Food Pantry, Table of Plenty, world mission connections, as well as Faith Formation activities, ecumenical and interfaith work in our community.

Weaving in and through these many joy-filled pieces and parts is the reality of our fragility and brokenness. We are human; we have not always agreed. But, I do believe our larger health as a church has emerged when we've spoken with transparency. Putting into action kindness, forgiveness, compassion and humility with one another and in wider circles beyond the church have helped me in ministry and on this journey. I have a deep awareness that our shared ministry has experienced blessing when each of us as partners has claimed our humanity in order to then embrace more openly God's Spirit.

I affirm the strengths so evident in all of you—empowering relationships, deep faith expressed in diverse ways, personal conviction rooted in Christ's love, expanding community awareness and outreach, open and affirming of the worth of every person as a child of God. Together this church is facing the challenges of a changing church in a changing society, willing to invite, include, involve as you share the message of Christ and the Good News Way.

I can and do give thanks for each of you, your support, your doubts, your heart of faith that sparks us in this church and beyond. So many Saints now gone, so many Saints present, alive and moving forward, and so many Saints yet to be formed out of the shared voice and witness which continues. I give thanks to the living God for the privilege of the call to this church, of serving as your pastor, of our sharing of the gifts of the Spirit.

In conversation with the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, and other elected Officers, my last Sunday will be July 29, my last day of work August 3, followed by my four weeks of vacation, **after which I am no longer able to provide pastoral services.**

Are there things yet to be done to God's glory? Of course! In the time before us some will be completed, some may be left undone and in God's time will be taken up. The change in pastoral leadership must now be left in the hands of this church's leaders. They will seek the guidance and support of the New Hampshire Conference UCC for this church during this time of transition. Further information regarding interim pastoral presence will be shared once defined.

In these unfolding days, be assured that I hold you in prayer. I believe God's grace will sustain us, each and every, for we want for each other all that is good, holy and healthy. The "Hymn of Promise" has a word which I believe we each can carry:

*There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody;  
there's a dawn in every darkness, bringing hope to you and me.  
From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery,  
unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.*

## TRUSTEES

### Financial Update:

Treasurers report, income for April 2018 was \$18,316, expenses for April 2018 was \$10,595, for net balance of \$7,721. Income for 2018 year to date is \$3,906 behind 2017, expenses for 2018 year to date is \$2,844 less than 2017. Mortgage, current balance is \$43,253. General fund balance is \$16,828.96, funds available are \$6,527.68, Memorial Fund balance is \$12,599.34.

The Horton family has donated \$5,000 - In memory of Roger and Toshiko Horton.

The Trustees discussed church safety issues and Mark provided a comprehensive report from the UCC workshop he and Robin Hamel recently attended regarding active shooter preparedness and response training - more to follow in the months to come.

The Pepler Trust is still in the process of being transferred or terminated - we are awaiting guidance from Maine lawyer Sue Thibodeau - we will keep posted.

### Building and Grounds planned maintenance items:

- The folding door in the kitchen, and one exit light in the hall needs to be repaired.
- The Faucet in the deacons room needs to be replaced.
- Parsonage items needing to be repaired or replaced: the carpet, copper piping in the cellar, and the house trim needs to be painted.
- Church repairs that need to be completed: elevator shaft roof leak, paint the church sanctuary, and varnish the wood windows and trim, stripe the parking lot, and replace all incandescent lighting with LED lighting.

Bruce Robbins reported 658 views of Pastor Mark's sermons in one months time. Thanks to Bruce and Geoff Day for taking the lead in bringing us into the 21st Century.

## **MISSIONS**

In June we will be putting up the sign up sheet for the school backpack project. We are collecting backpacks and the following items: glue sticks, washable markers, pencil cases, pencil sharpeners, blunt scissors, pencils, notebooks, rulers, colored pencils, folders, and pink erasers. We ask that the items be brought into church by Sunday, August 19th. The Mission Committee will put the items into the backpacks and deliver them to local elementary schools in Berwick and Lebanon, Maine, and in Somersworth and Rollinsford, New Hampshire. If you choose, you may "adopt a backpack". This means you donate a backpack that you have already filled with the needed items. We have donated filled backpacks to these schools for a number of years. The filled backpacks are given to students who would not otherwise have a backpack to start school with. They are always greatly appreciated by both the teachers and students.

We have sent 19 boxes of medicine bottles to Samaritan's Purse. Each box has 100, 200, or 300 bottles in it. These medicine bottles make it easier for people to get their medicine. We are looking for the brown medicine bottles with the lockable caps. No white bottles please. If you have any questions you may speak with Pat Whitten.

# OPEN & AFFIRMING

Greetings from the Open and Affirming Committee.

We continue to work on several events, believe there has been great progress and we are making a positive contribution to our community.

**Informational events:** Our Committee has been very engaged in activities internal and external to our church. It is our intent to learn from others and share what we learn as we continue on our Open and Affirming journey.

- Panel Discussion at First Parish Federated Church (FPFC) in South Berwick: Mark, Geoff and Nancy participated in an Open and Affirming exploratory panel discussion with several local ONA churches. It was very well attended and the FPFC members had a lot of questions, we had a great discussion and as usual it was a learning experience for us as well.
- Rejection by Church and Community: Why ONA is Important: Gerri presented this very enlightening topic to several other local churches. We all walked away with a new appreciation of the challenges faced by transgender individuals.
- Community Round Table with our community churches: The intent of the round table was to share what was working and the challenges we collectively face as Open and Affirming churches. It was a great discussion and we found a lot of commonality in our experiences.
- Panel Discussion at The Community Congregational Church in Greenland: Mark, Geoff and Nancy participated in an Open and Affirming exploratory panel discussion. Another well attended session with great questions and discussions.

**Conversations at the High School:** Our Committee approached the Principal and Guidance Department at Somersworth High School, with regard to facilitating some type of community conversation with youth. Topic was open, though when Mark met with Guidance Counselor Denis Pelletier, there was interest in the topic of Transgender/ Transitioning and LGBT + Youth. Our ONA Committee discussed this, and as Gerri Cannon brings a skill set and wealth of personal dimension to this, and was willing to be the facilitator, she came up with a six-session series. Each week Mark, Denis Pelletier, Gerri and students were invited to gather. Topics included, but not limited to: terminology, asking basic questions—what do you think you know, identifying challenges, where do you get help and support and where is this available? Specific agencies that are in our community were named. How about parents, family support? What do you do if you are bullied, attacked, to whom do you report? What are parental supports? Who are the allies for youth, generally, and transgender youth in particular? Are there “safe spaces” locally—where? Who are the “safe” people to talk to? What is your vision for school and community as a better, safer place? Do you feel empowered moving forward?

We, of course, went off topic as ideas formed. While we peaked at 2 students, we really did have open dialogue, and those in attendance felt the time very worthwhile and a sign of support from our local church. Gerri was wonderful in bringing a “wider perspective” of current legislative actions due to her involvement in political and community circles. As a pattern or template for further conversations on other diverse topics this pattern would work well for student interaction, or at another time (evening), for parent or community presence.

If you have ideas, we would love to hear them. We would also appreciate your involvement, a little or a lot, with our committee.
