TRANSITION TEAM

The Transition Team will be holding two more workshops in March, building on last year's workshops where we focus on our history and all of the many gifts – spiritual and otherwise – that God has gifted each member of our church with. One of our new workshops coming up will relate to the make-up of the geographic area in which our church is situated, that is, our demographics. The other new workshop will look at all of the things we have and can do to connect us to the needs of God's people in this area.

We will then be completing our workshops.

All of these workshops together will help to provide insight into our congregation so that the Transition Team can begin to consider the questions in the church profile, such as: Who are we? Who is our neighbor? and Who is God calling us to become? Renewed discovery of the congregation's purpose will make the search clearer and more effective for the Search Committee, and more appealing for candidates. In addition, based upon your input at our congregational workshops and at other times, the Transition Team, with the help of conference staff, will determine which type of pastoral leadership will best serve our church - full time, part time, or other, the scope of pastoral responsibilities, and compensation package. When the profile is completed, it is submitted to the NH Conference for review and then made available nationally through the UCC ministry opportunities online postings.

- Are you willing to become a part of this very important next step joining the Transition Team?
- Once the Transition Team has developed a profile that they believe represents the church well and will encourage candidates to apply, the very next step will be to form the Search Committee. Please be in prayer about how you might serve. We'll have more on the Search Committee in next month's newsletter!



So, beloved of God, how did it go? The reflections, I mean. Remember, in last month's newsletter, we going to reflect together. We read Matthew 25:31-40 (it's printed in last month's newsletter article if your Bible isn't handy), and we were going to do a few things:

"So, let me ask you to do a little exercise. Take a piece of paper, a pen, and go to a comfortable chair and sit down. Relax a bit. Pray that God will open your heart. Ask for God's guidance. Then reflect for a bit and write your impressions of Who First Parish is Now. Then think about the area in which this church is physically located, and consider Who is Our Neighbor? Write your reflections on your paper. And then pray for a bit about Who God is Calling First Parish to Become, and write your reflections down. After you've done this, thank God for guiding your reflection.

If you haven't had a chance to reflect – I know, life, right?! – maybe you can take a few moments after reading this month's newsletter to open your heart to God and think and pray about these things. Make some notes! Who is First Parish now? Who is our neighbor? Who is God calling First Parish to become?

I want to welcome the gracious and generous people who have stepped into new leadership roles in the church, as well as those who have stayed on. By the time you get this, several of them will have joined me in attending *Prepared to Serve*, devoting a full day to excellent resources and workshops provided by the New Hampshire Conference to grow lay leadership and all ministry in our churches. We are so fortunate that such an awesome event is presented every year, and such stellar resources are available to us in the United Church of Christ! And if you have been thinking of stepping up and helping during this transition time, but can't decide where your gifts might best be used, please talk to me so that we can see together where you might serve best!

Some people liken a church's transition time between settled pastors to a family road trip. Did you take road trips when you were growing up? No doubt there had been some planning that involved decisions about where to go. And the logistics had been considered, route, rest stops, lodging, etc. And the trip had a goal. For example, we're going to New York to see Niagara Falls, and on the way we're going to stop at the Finger Lakes to see how beautiful they are. I remember fondly a family trip to DC to see the historical monuments and the cherry blossoms.

Was there someone in the car with you – or maybe it was you?! – who every couple of hours kept saying, "Are we there yet?"

It's natural to want to just identify the next settled pastor and start to get to know them. But this would miss the essential gifts and benefits of the transition time. The transition work that the congregation does is all designed to help the congregation to select a pastor who is called to the very mission that the congregation has discerned God is calling it to. Pastors are not widgets; each is called to ministry in unique ways and has unique gifts. This transition time of getting to know who this church has become – and being able to articulate it to anyone who asks – is a gift to the congregation that when used to best advantage will help the congregation to select the best pastor with whom to minister together. The search committee's work can only be as good as the input provided by the congregation! So, I urge you, sit down for a few moments and relax in the goodness of God. Read the Gospel section in last month's newsletter. Consider the reflection questions at the beginning of this message. Reflect on your time in this congregation. Reflect on the community within which the church is situated and how it has changed over time. Where do you see God in the church and in the community? To what work of God in the world do you feel in your heart that God is calling First Church to be and to do in this community?

Please keep in touch with me as you ponder these questions. The Transition Team wants to have the fullest sense of the congregation's reflections on these themes, and they're counting on you!
