

HOLY WEEK begins on Palm Sunday and ends of Easter Sunday. Gather for worship around the events of our Savior Jesus' last week. Many of us are familiar with the 19th century hymn 'Beneath the Cross of Jesus'. It is a hymn that often makes an appearance this time of year, as we move into the season of Lent. In these days before Easter, we take a period of time (40 days), and reflect on our relationships with God and each other. As the song reflects on Jesus' death on the cross, driven there by the fearful powers of the world, with His sacrifice showing love that gives up even life itself for his friends, we read, "mine eye at times can see the very dying form of One who suffered there for me: and from my stricken heart with tears two wonders I confess, the wonders of redeeming love and my unworthiness."

During this season of Lent, these are two wonders we might reflect on. The wonders of God's redeeming love, and our own unworthiness. That might sound at first thought like it means reflecting on just how terrible we are, but that's not it! Instead, there is a great piece of "Good News" here, a reminder that our connections to God and others are not transactional, but are based on something called 'grace'.

Grace in a Christian sense is "the free and unmerited favor of God, as manifested in the salvation of sinners and the bestowal of blessings.", according to the Oxford Dictionary. See, if God loves us and blesses us because we do good, or if we give gifts to each other because of what we expect to get in return, then, as Jesus points out in the gospels, "What credit is that?" Instead, God's love and blessing are given to us freely and unconditionally, not because we did anything to earn it, but because of God's own goodness and love.

And so, when we reflect on 'sinfulness' in this Lent, let's remember just what it is that we're talking about. Sin is not about an arbitrary list of do's and don'ts, its about where we are not reflecting that kind of grace-filled love to others, and where we can do better. Love "always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres." This Lent, lets look to the cross, to Jesus' love for us and blessing us not because of us, but because of who He is, and look around at our neighbors, whoever and however they come into our lives, for ways to love better, trust more, hope more, and persevere.

Earthquake in Turkey & Syria: The news continues to unfold about the devastating earthquake on the border of Turkey and Syria. The death toll continues to rise, and has grown to 44,330. This is shattering news and adds to the challenges of the war in this area for over a decade.
