

Food Collection for the pantry: Our Mission Committee would like to start collecting food for The Community Food Pantry, which is located on the first floor of our church. This will be an ongoing mission for our church.

The Community Food Pantry was organized by our previous minister, Rev. Mark Rideout, and is run entirely by volunteers from our local churches. The food pantry is a member of the states of Maine's and New Hampshire's USDA and serves anyone in Maine and New Hampshire who are struggling to make ends meet.

During the past three months of 2025, the pantry had 1,361 family visits for an average of 454 visits per month.

The director, Pat Vachon, appreciates our help and has asked that we collect **canned pasta** (such as **Spaghetti O's**) and **canned baked beans** (such as **B&M baked beans**). These are items they currently have to purchase at the regular price.



The Easter Baskets that so many brought in items for the children at The Community Food Pantry was a huge success! They were given to families the week of April 6th, and the parents who picked them up were very grateful. A sincere thank you to all who donated items for the baskets.

Now we are getting fliers out for our Holly Daze Fair. If you know someone who is a "crafter" and would like to sell their items at our fair, let Diane Chessman know so she can get an application to them.

Also, we know it is too early to think about this, but we will be filling Christmas stockings for the children again.

The women's group meets every Tuesday morning from 9-11am. If you have a craft and would be willing to teach us how to do it, we would love to have you join us. We are always looking for something new to do.
